A digital librarian must have a master's degree in LIS. The digital librarian should also have strong technical skills (digital publishing platforms, management of digital files, digital resources, metadata development) in addition to communication (with patrons, other librarians, or staff members), research (research for social media, blogs), problem solving (trouble shoot tech issues, or develop new processes and procedures), and organizational skills. Digital librarians may work at various places, including libraries, museums, publishing companies, or the government. The average salary for a digital librarian is \$59,000 and the top 10/0 annual salary is \$97,000. The employment prospect for digital librarians will grow at an average rate over the next decade. Most digital librarians work a forty-hour work week.

a) Nithyananda, K. V., & G. T., K. (2023). Libraries and Digital Humanities: The Intellectual Property Rights Perspective. *DESIDOC Journal of Library & Information Technology*, *43*(4), 300–304. https://doi-org.ezproxy.lib.uwm.edu/10.14429/djlit.43.04.19217

The article examines how intellectual property rights puts a librarian in the cross hairs of acting as an intellectual property lawyer. The article sights the origins of copyrights and how copyrights are useful. The article states informative perspectives as to how the librarian may have to negotiate with trusts, estates, or publishing companies.

b) Cole, F. (2023). Supplementing the Stacks: Expanding Access and Engagement through Sustainable Digital Exhibitions. *Theological Librarianship*, 16(2), 7–16. https://doi-org.ezproxy.lib.uwm.edu/10.31046/tl.v16i2.3341

This article is about how digital exhibitions are needed to attract the interest of new patrons. The article also cites the challenges of digital exhibitions (money invested, physical parts of exhibitions not transferring to the digital medium. Finally, librarians must produce a way to measure the success of digital collections which range from attendance to how well patrons interact with the exhibition.

c) Yong-Chang Jiang, & Hao Li. (2023). The Theoretical Basis and Basic Principles of Knowledge Network Construction in Digital Libraries. *Knowledge Organization*, 50(4), 245–256. https://doi-org.ezproxy.lib.uwm.edu/10.5771/0943-7444-2023-4-245

The article states due to growth in information resources there is a need to whittle down how information processed in digital libraries. The authors offer a solution of using

knowledge networks to make connections between knowledge entities. The authors suggest creating grids to make this happen.

The article focuses on unique digital collections and the importance of using proper URL practices. The article states URLS do not lead back to the source of the collection. The article advocates using persistent URLS to ensure cited URLs to digital objects remain accessible.

The article focused on how the University of Floria made upgrades to their digital library. An interesting fact in the article is the library employed developers who had no prior digital library experience. The upgrade was successful because the focus was on a user-centered design.

Primary Duties & Responsibilities

- Effectively creates and enhances descriptive metadata in the digital repository, currently Piction, applies appropriate schema based on standards, best practices, and the needs for digital collections. Participates in resource description initiatives supporting the advancement of the discoverability of digital collections.
- Oversees the metadata workflows within the (Digital Asset Metadata System) DAMS. This includes management of metadata workflows, description, and tracking. In collaboration with the Digital Initiatives Metadata Librarian, develops descriptive standards and best practices; develops and implements description workflows; maintains quality assurance, and generates reports.

- Develops policies and procedures around the use of (Digital Asset Metadata System) DAMS and description that abides by best practices/standards and that reflect organizational priorities.
- Collaborates and communicates regularly with the Head of Digital Processing, Preservation and Reformatting regarding project timelines, system workflows and procedures. Acts as liaison between digital asset stakeholders and the descriptive metadata process.
- Collaborates with the Discovery Coordinator on metadata application profiles, and normalization of repository metadata within the discovery platform.

Participate in library-wide and staff development activities, including department training activities. Perform other technical services duties as assigned.
